FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO

As we reflect on this past fiscal year, I am proud to report several notable achievements. The hard work and dedication of Baptist Homes Society employees and our many volunteers, with the guidance of our talented and generous Board of Directors, has made this a successful year for stabilization and implementation of strategic goals. During fiscal year 2016-2017, several key tasks were completed that are essential for Baptist Homes Society's future growth.

In the first half of the year, we finalized the Phase II expansion plans for Providence Point and began to accept reservations for apartments in a third residential tower. New marketing materials and marketing strategies were put in place. Toward the end of the fiscal year, the tower—now named Hamilton Tower—had accepted 30 reservations, and a groundbreaking ceremony for Providence Chapel had taken place.

Baptist Homes Society's corporate structure changed this year as well. A new business entity has been created in preparation for expansion of our services to seniors in our community. Baptist Senior Services (BSS) is now the official umbrella organization for Baptist Homes Foundation and Baptist Homes Society and its two senior living communities.

As you read about many of this year's updates and improvements throughout the pages of this report, please accept our sincere thanks for making them possible. They could not happen without your continued support and confidence. We count you among our many blessings and thank you for your generosity and trust.

OUR LEADERSHIP

On July 1, 2016, the Baptist Homes Society Board of Directors officially adopted a resolution to also serve as the Board of Directors for Baptist Senior Services. It was created as an umbrella organization for the new corporate structure. BSS will provide opportunities for the development of related business entities such as home care and management services. Throughout the year, the Board continued to work on strategies for Providence Point's Phase II expansion and other strategic plan initiatives.

The Baptist Homes Foundation Board of Directors, along with the Foundation Board Advisors, successfully launched a capital campaign to endow the organization's chaplaincy program and to construct a nondenominational chapel on Providence Point's campus. The initial silent phase of the project began last year. As we near our \$3.5 million goal, every Board member has supported this project.

In fiscal year 2016-2017, the Board elected Jeff Tindall as Chair of the Board of Directors and recognized Jan Wenzel, who had served in that role since 2010 and was instrumental in strategically preparing the organization for its current expansion. With deep appreciation, the organization also welcomed Dale Killmeyer and Karen Timko to the Baptist Homes Society Board of Directors and new member Dr. Julia Wilcox to the Baptist Homes Foundation Board.

HIGHLIGHTS OF 2016-2017

The senior living industry continues to change rapidly. New regulations and guidelines are frequently being introduced to keep pace with advances in technology and improvements to medical treatment, as well as to address the economic strain caused by the aging 'baby boomer' population. Following are just a few of the highlights of fiscal year 2016-2017:

Quality Assurance and Performance Improvement (QAPI) ~ A commitment to person-centered care is—and always has been—at the core of our mission to “uplift one person at a time.” The importance of individualized care has more recently come to the forefront with new QAPI standards introduced by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS). To proactively meet QAPI guidelines, Baptist Homes Society provides regular staff education on QAPI measures. Cross-campus teams meet regularly to review the person-centered philosophy that is incorporated into all aspects of the organization. This attention to quality has allowed both Baptist Homes and Providence Point to be recognized as 5-star facilities in the CMS Nursing Home Compare ratings.



Baptist Homes Society now has three Centers of Excellence: Rehabilitation, Dementia Care and Wellness.

Centers of Excellence ~ Building on the two Centers of Excellence established in the prior fiscal year that focus on rehabilitation and wellness, Baptist Homes Society (BHS) developed the third Center of Excellence, focused on dementia care. The Center of Excellence in Dementia Care establishes training and care protocols and develops innovative approaches for performance improvement.

Recognition for Quality ~ During the year, Baptist Homes and/or Providence Point were recognized by Kendal Outreach, the American College of Health Care Administrators, and the Department of Human Services.

SPICES of Life ~ To increase awareness of Baptist Homes Society’s holistic approach to wellness, a program called *SPICES of Life* was developed. SPICES, the acronym for the six wellness components (Spiritual, Physical, Intellectual, Community, Emotional, and Social), emphasizes the relationship between the individual components and their impact on an individual’s wellbeing.



SPICES of Life was introduced this year to promote the holistic approach to wellness offered at our campuses.

New Parent Organization ~ On July 1, 2016, the Board of Directors approved a corporate reorganization. Baptist Senior Services officially became the parent organization of Baptist Homes Society and Baptist Homes Foundation.

Providence Point Expansion ~ Plans for Providence Point’s expansion were finalized and approvals for the project were completed. Floor plans for the apartment tower residences, expanded common areas, and the nondenominational chapel were completed. Groundbreaking for the chapel project took place on June 14, 2017.

Employee Incentive Plan ~ The Board of Directors reviewed and approved a Financial Responsibility Plan to provide staff incentives for their role in maintaining the budget. The program recognizes that everyone at BHS is responsible for our success in achieving financial goals. The program will be fully implemented during the 2017-2018 fiscal year.

Record Occupancy ~ Occupancy was strong across the campuses during fiscal

year 2016-2017, and especially so in the residential living area of Providence Point. Occupancy there topped 97 percent for much of the year—the highest it has been since the community opened in 2009.

Technology Updates ~ Baptist Homes Society began replacing network servers and upgrading the IT infrastructure to improve service, function, and security. The project, near completion at the end of the year, has resulted in improved communication with healthcare providers and CMS, streamlined recordkeeping and reporting, and improved service.

Collaboration ~ Baptist Homes Society has created partnerships with several hospitals and universities to provide access to the latest advances in care for our residents. Partners in 2016-2017 have included Carnegie-Mellon University, the University of Pittsburgh, UPMC, and others. These collaborations have supported research in osteoporosis, exercises for improved balance, and the effectiveness of monitoring health through the use of electronic health kiosks.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Through outstanding service to those living and working within our communities as well as those who live in the surrounding area, Baptist Homes Society continually strives toward its vision: Seniors in our community will experience the most fulfilling life possible.

That vision continues to stand the test of time. Our service to the community reaches well beyond the walls of our Scott Township and Mt. Lebanon campuses. Our outreach efforts range from hosting free continuing education programs for healthcare professionals to providing wellness presentations in area senior apartments and community centers. Our expert staff also speak at area schools, healthcare facilities, and collaborate with others involved in the senior living industry.

Our commitment to providing benevolent care is also a core value. BHS has never asked anyone to leave because their funds were depleted through no fault of their own. Benevolent care is part of our legacy, and is as important today as it was 107 years ago, when the organization was founded.

Now in its third year, Baptist Homes Society hosts a senior fair that offers flu vaccines, pneumonia shots and health screenings to hundreds of area seniors. The event continues to grow, and brings dozens of service providers, wellness experts and health professionals together, creating a convenient resource tool for older adults.

Much of what we do would not be possible without a large roster of volunteers. This includes the BSS/BHS Board of Directors as well as the Baptist Homes Foundation Board. The Baptist Homes Auxiliary, established in 1947, continues to support the organization in a multitude of ways. Close to 200 volunteers, including some of the residents of Baptist Manor and Providence Point, give hundreds of hours of service to benefit residents of our Healthcare Centers.

Beyond what is tallied in this Community Benefit Report, our residents, staff, Board members and volunteers touch the lives of those around them in countless ways. For the sake of reporting, their actions and contributions are given a monetary value, but the service they provide is truly invaluable. We acknowledge and thank everyone who has contributed in some way.

OUR FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

BHS is committed to its mission of providing the highest quality of care. Being good stewards of the resources that have been entrusted to us is a key factor in meeting the goals of that mission. Our efforts are impacted daily by issues like increasing costs, decreasing medical insurance coverage, and an aging population. Yet, we are responsive and provide the services that are most needed in ways that have the highest impact.

The operations at both Baptist Homes and Providence Point continued to be stable in the 2016-2017 fiscal year. Between the two campuses, we served an average of 728 seniors each day. As a result, our financial performance was strong with revenues exceeding budget. Our managers and staff were prudent stewards of our financial resources and kept our expenses below budget while, at the same time, continued to provide extraordinary service to our residents.

As noted elsewhere in this report, on July 1, 2016, the structure of the Baptist Homes Society Board changed. The BHS Board also assumed the responsibility of overseeing the operation of a new parent corporation, Baptist Senior Services. The Board of Directors and executives of the organization consented to this change so that the organization can be responsive to the rising demand for more services for seniors in our area.

Providence Point's occupancy levels were especially strong in our two residential living towers and 35 patio homes throughout fiscal year 2016-2017. Because of this, it was determined that the Phase II expansion should move ahead. By early spring, the Providence Point marketing team had begun accepting reservations for a third apartment tower. Expansion plans include additional dining and food prep areas, new common areas, expanded concierge area and a nondenominational chapel. Groundbreaking for Providence Chapel, which is a privately funded project, was held on June 14, 2017.

Changes within the healthcare industry continue to create challenges for BHS and other senior service and care providers. BHS is committed to remaining at the forefront in meeting and exceeding new regulatory requirements, addressing the many changes, adopting new technologies, and responding to the needs of area seniors in a proactive manner.

BAPTIST HOMES FOUNDATION

As the cornerstone of our organization's legacy of benevolence, Baptist Homes Foundation is tasked with providing the resources that allow the organization to demonstrate our core values of faith, benevolence, service, ethics and wellness. The charitable care we offer to residents whose resources are insufficient or have been depleted is central to those values.

During this fiscal year, the Samaritan Fund for Resident Assistance enabled us to distribute nearly \$4 million in benevolent and uncompensated care. We were also able to raise capital funds this year. With the ongoing support of our donors, who give generously to sustain our mission,

we will continue this cycle of benevolence and respond to the needs of those in our communities.

To that end, Baptist Homes Foundation achieved several milestones in the 2016-2017 fiscal year:

- Raised more than \$1.7 million in cash, pledges and non-cash gifts.
- Broke a record by netting more than \$113,000 at the 24th Annual Baptist Homes Foundation Charity Golf Invitational.
- Generated a record \$260,128 in gifts to the Employee Appreciation Fund (EAF) campaign. Approximately 600

employees received year-end gifts for their dedication to our residents.

- Presented the first PRN Dining Services Staff Scholarship.
- Conducted our annual donor recognition event with a luncheon at LeMont Restaurant that was completely underwritten by two donors.
- Restructured the development office while saving \$20,000.
- Received three distributions totaling more than \$2,000 from mineral rights received in Monongalia County, WV via a bequest.
- Increased the number of Charitable IRA Rollover gifts from 3 to 21, increasing the amount given the previous fiscal year by more than \$160,000.
- Received an \$80,000 grant from B.K. Simon Family Charitable Foundation for activities staff, marking the 10th year the Simon Family has helped deliver service on our BH campus.
- Doubled the number of participants in our Many Hands, One Heart employee campaign.
- Received the fourth \$50k installment of a 10-year \$500,000 pledge for the Baptist Homes campus.
- Received ten irrevocable pledges of Providence Point entry fees, bringing the entry fee pledge total to \$1.1 million over the past two years.
- Held a groundbreaking ceremony for Providence Chapel on Flag Day, June 14, 2017.
